This mum was 12 weeks pregnant when doctors found a cancerous lump in her womb

Tracey Moberly, from Bargoed, was diagnosed with cancer of the womb in 1991. She wearing unity bands to mark World Cancer Day on February 4

When expectant mum Tracey Moberly was told she had a <u>tumour</u> in her womb 12 weeks into the pregnancy of her second son, her world fell apart.

The artist and author, who had already given birth to a healthy baby boy 10 months earlier, feared neither herself nor her son Izaac would survive a procedure to remove the cancerous lump.

But after begging her consultant to postpone the operation until her baby was fully formed the pair both survived against the odds to tell the tale.

Diagnosed with cancer at 26 years old "I was worried for the new baby already fully formed and growing inside me and for the

baby I would be leaving behind," said <u>Tracey</u>, who was diagnosed with cancer at the age of 26.

"I was told I had the worst type of cancer and the stage it had reached was very high. The doctor telling me had apologised saying he'd never had to break news like this and in such a way."

Thanks to her expert surgeons at Saint Mary's Hospital in Manchester, who were able to remove the tumour while she had a caesarean, both mother and baby survived.

"It was far more of a risk to me to delay the operation as I was told the baby was breathing and would be fine," added Tracey, who spends half her home life in her hometown of Bargoed and the other in London.

"I wouldn't have known about it otherwise. It could have led to two babies growing up without a mother."

"I'm just so thankful that I went for the 12-week scan, which I didn't actually need as I'd

Eccentric artist Tracey, who published an autobiography made up of 3,000 text messages in 2011, says both Jake and Izaac are now flourishing in university.

She said the traumatic experience gave her a greater desire to live life to its fullest.
